## The Third Way

Week after week he offered a harsh critique of the morning sermon at the end of worship with a vehemence that was surprising and off-putting. My initial reaction was a defensive self-examination, but over time, I realized I was not the reason for his bitterness and anger, I was merely one target among many. Still, my first inclination was to ignore his comments and dismiss him. In prayer, I became less focused on his words and more aware of the effect of his behavior. My heart began to melt. He was distant and cut-off from his emotions and others. He was isolated and alone. In a word – he was ‘prickly.’

Through prayer, I was challenged to cross the distance and engage with him. I remember my initial response to that challenge, “Are you kidding?” As I prayed, I was reminded of God’s love for this person and so I sought ways to love him and continued to hold him before God. He didn’t change. He continued to engage me in doctrinal disputes often with a vehemence. But I changed. Instead of keeping him at arms length, I would wrap my arms around him. Instead of pulling away, I moved closer. When he died a while ago, I wept for the loss of a friendship that we had forged.

The work of reconciliation often employs a perspective known as the third-way. Jesus used this method often in his teachings. Here is an example:

You have heard that it was said, ‘You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’ But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; ... For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Be perfect, therefore, as your Heavenly Father is perfect.

The above report (all #s are for a 6 month period) was given to the congregation on July 30 and believe it is important to also provide the above information to the all the members and friends of Eastwood through the Beacon. As you can see we have maintained a similar total budget for the last three years but our financial giving amounts have varied.

As we enter into the fall of 2017, our financial committee will begin to evaluate this year's income and expenses and start working on our 2018 budget. Because of the apparent shortfall in general fund giving the Board of Deacons and staff are watching closely to how our monies are expended and cutting costs where we can. Unfortunately, cutting costs usually affects our abilities to do different ministries that we had budgeted for earlier in the year.

We trusted God last year (2016) when we raised our mission giving from 8% to 10% and were amazed at how God honored our commitment. And we continue to trust God with His Church and our finances as He blesses us in so many ways each day.

Giving is simply an act of worship, and our prayer is that we use these gifts to God in a way that honors and glorifies His Name. May each of you continue to be blessed as we journey together in Christ.


