**Psalm 127:3-5** *“Behold, children are a gift of the Lord, the fruit of the womb is a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, so are the children of one’s youth. How blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them; they will not be ashamed when they speak with their enemies in the gate.”*

As we enter the New Year we are reminded of how often God gives us what we do not deserve. This year I was given a great opportunity to do what I am passionate about; the chance to cultivate the love I have for Christ in the next generation with Full Draw Student Ministry.

The name Full Draw started with a respect for arrows. I have always been fascinated with arrows. There is a lot of symbolism between arrows and our walk with Christ. It takes time to reach full maturity; if you stop growing, life can bring you down. If you aren't anchored in your faith, your mission, or your goal your spirit will began to lack. If you don't have patience in your walk, you wont be able to see the wonders God bestows in your life. If you are afraid to go all the way and get out of your comfort zone you could deny your true potential. The bible says our youth are like arrows and we are blessed to have a quiver full of them to send them out into the world to make an impact.

This is the purpose and base for Full Draw Student Ministry, to provide our youth with a new beginning and a fresh, exciting start. Full Draw is dedicated to cultivating a culture of intimate relationships with God and an excitement about learning about Him. We have created a new schedule that we are very excited about. Saturday evenings from 6 pm - 8 pm we will be meeting for a more contemporary and traditional youth gathering. This will include games, food, worship, and a lesson with discussion. Sunday mornings we will meet before church at 9:15 am - 10:15 am for a deeper look into books of the Bible by going through verse by verse.

We will also have boards with upcoming event posters, and monthly calendars in both the youth room and the main atrium of the church. We will go on mission trips, both local and foreign, camping trips, ski trips, and other exciting adventures to get out into nature and experience God in the wilderness and adventure.

### What can we do to help?

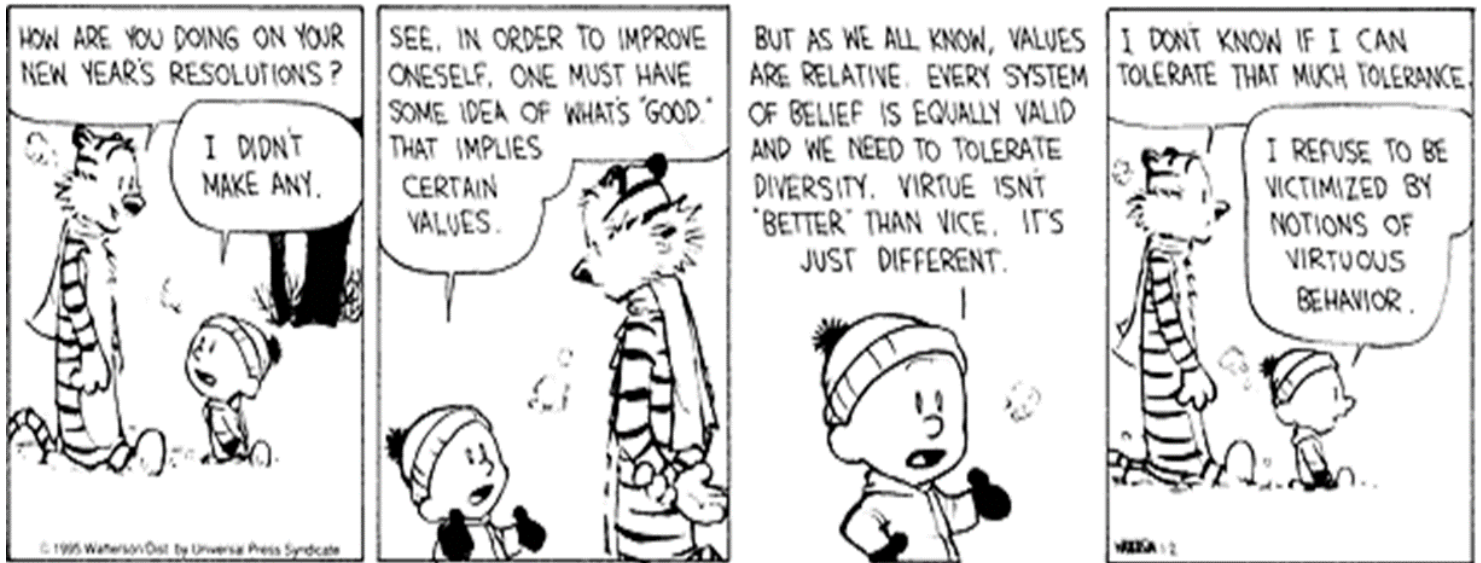

### Mission Giving Opportunity

January's Mission Giving Opportunity will be Rainbow Acres. Rainbow Acres was founded in 1974, but existed as a dream long before. Rev. Ralph Showers grew up to be an accomplished American Baptist pastor and a social visionary, but spent much of his childhood struggling through school with learning disabilities, including dyslexia. He dreamed of creating a place where adults with developmental disabilities could lead lives guided by meaning, purpose, dignity and spiritual strength. Through physical, emotional and operations setbacks, this dream survived to become Rainbow Acres - a special place where miracles occur every day. For over 40 years, Rainbow Acres has been empowering people with developmental disabilities to live to their fullest potential with dignity and purpose.

Rainbow Acres is located in the central part of Arizona, just an hour and a half drive north of Phoenix and 20 minutes from Sedona and its incredible Red Rocks. Residential facilities include twelve homes, each with 10 private bedrooms and a Caregiver suite, and eight on-bedroom apartments that allow a greater degree of independence for Ranchers who meet rigorous requirements of self-management.

Program areas include:

- The Worden Lifelong learning Center
- The Daehler building with multiple craft rooms and rec room
- Three greenhouses and a small orchard
- A modern, well-equipped barn with stables and a riding arena
- Trails for walkers, bicyclers and highly experienced horseback riders.
