What is Love?

We are now two months into the New Year and time is already flying! The month of February is a peculiar one, due to a peculiar holiday. Valentines day, a holiday where every one shows their love for others by buying gifts, candies, or ridiculously huge stuffed animals. Valentines day often comes with a lot of *clichés* and a lot of unhealthy ideals. This time of year we see romantic movies in theaters, most of which portray very unhealthy views of relationships among significant others, friends, or families. By idolizing these relationships we see on the big screen we can fall into some of those same unhealthy habits. It is so important that we look at how our personal relationships reflect our relationship with God.

At Full Draw this month we are tackling a new series called "What is Love?" In this series we are discussing the different types of love: *Agape*, *Phileo*, and *Eros*. When we begin to think of how to love we typically use God's examples as a model. *Agape* love is the highest form of love, a divine love, a love that is unconditional, and one that only God can really perform due to the fact that it is completely and 100% *UNCONDITIONAL*. It is without boundaries, has no requirements, no pre-existing rules, and is given even though we don't deserve it.

Phileo love is a Greek word that means an affectionate regard between friends, or equals. It is considered a "brotherly love." That is why Philadelphia is known as the city of brotherly love – it is taken from the word *Phileo*. The bible holds *Agape* and *Phileo* love in very high regards. In John it says "Greater is no love than this, that a man lay his life down for a friend." *Phileo* love forces us to think deeper toward others. Unlike *Agape* love, it is based upon your affection for a friend. In some of the original texts of the bible, when Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him, the first two times Jesus is using the *Agape* type of love, the third time however Jesus uses the *Phileo* type of love. Jesus knew Peter loved him because he was his Lord, and because of the love God asks us to show all people, but he wanted to know why Peter loved him intimately as a friend.

The third type of love is "*Eros*" or "*Erotas*." It is a love like the intimate love between spouse's and Jesus' love for the church. *Eros* is a passionate love. How much did Jesus love the church? Enough to die on the cross for his bride. *Eros* love is reserved for marriage, for physical and spiritual bonding. It is meant to go deeper. It is also meant to be an intimate and passionate love for our relationship with God, a "*divine romance*." Where we have love, we must also have God, where we have passion, we must remember God, where we grow deeper with our spouses, we must simultaneously grow deeper with God, for "A cord of three strands, is not easily broken."

My challenge for myself, and all of us, this month is to reflect on these three types of loves in our lives, how to implement and practice them within our relationship with God and with family, friends, and strangers.

Let us love like God loves!
