Notes from the American Baptist Churches of the Central Pacific Coast Board of Ministry Meeting - February 8 - 9, 2018

Suzan and I traveled to Camp Arrah Wanna where I attended my first meeting of the Region board mentioned above. The members of this board come from both Oregon and California as our region now consists of 84 or so churches reaching from the Washington State border to just south of Fresno, California.

The mission statement opening paragraph reads as follows:

The churches comprising the American Baptist Churches of the Central Pacific Coast are joined together in a covenant partnership to resource, empower and equip one another to discover and fulfill their unique mission in their communities and around the world. They are committed to cooperate in the mission and ministries that can be best accomplished jointly. The Region structure and staff are established and maintained collectively by the churches to accomplish this mission.

In order to accomplish the above Mission Statement, a Board of Ministry shall be established that represents the ministries of the American Baptist Churches of the Central Pacific Coast.

That being stated the remainder of the document is the explanation of the Board of Ministry, its function, membership, polity, officers, meetings, power, executive committee, ministry teams, nominating committee, parliamentary authority, and amendments.

Our Executive Minister, Steve Bils, took us through a very thorough explanation and training of the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws so we in attendance would be better able to see our role as members. We participated in the business meeting of the board, hearing and addressing the normal items that appear before a board of this nature. There were several items regarding growth of churches being served by the region including the addition of three new congregations who applied and were accepted into membership of the region. There were a couple sensitive issues still being addressed by the board during the coming week where a direction will be established.

The guest speaker for the two days was Dr. Jolene Erlacher who has researched and written a book "Millennials in Ministry" dealing with the generations as they change and how they can be cared for by the church as each one comes of age. I would encourage any of you interested to visit her web site "Leading Tomorrow," Strategies for a New Generation. She travels the world speaking and educating churches with these strategies for working with our Christian brothers and sisters from Generation X, Millennials, and Generation Y.

All in all, the time with faithful American Baptist Believers was very warming and uplifting.




