What's Happening An Update on the Interim

As I enter my seventh (yes seventh!) week at Eastwood I find myself somewhat surprised that it has flown by so quickly. Now that I am beginning to understand the inner workings of Eastwood I will be focusing more attention on the interim process itself.

On Sunday, May 20 a number of you filled out a short survey that is helping me determine which of the 5 Tasks of the Interim are most important for the church to address. The majority of those who filled out the survey indicated that the top priority was to commit to a new direction in ministry. The second was to discover a new identity, that is, gain an understanding of who you are as a congregation and how that influences the future. The third was allowing needed leadership changes by affirming and facilitating such changes.

The long-term goal of the interim is to prepare the congregation to commit to new directions in ministry and to welcome a new pastor with whom you will partner to pursue a shared vision for future ministry. To that end, we will start by exploring the past in such a way that patterns of God's activity may be found and in celebrating God's unfailing love throughout the church's history.

In these early days of the interim and the pastoral search there are some tasks that overlap. Therefore, I will be working with representatives from the Pastoral Search Committee on those that do.

In the meantime, I would like to ask each of you to think about your faith journey with the church and find or create an item that symbolizes that journey. In a few weeks we will be using these items to create a display which can be enjoyed by everyone. Please provide a paragraph describing how the item symbolizes your faith journey with Eastwood.

Capital Improvement Campaign Progress Update

We are continuing to move forward with our Capital Campaign projects. Last year, several elements of the overall plan were completed. The blue windows were replaced with energy efficient, low-e, opaque glass. New sinks and counters were installed in the downstairs classrooms.

We had hoped to be able to move the Crow's Nest sound booth to the main floor last year, but we had trouble finding contractors that weren't too busy! A bid has now been accepted and we will be starting work on this project May 14. (That is coming right up!) This will require the removal of several of the back pews to accommodate the new sound booth. There will be some disruption in the sanctuary as the construction will take at least two weeks or more.

The funding for these projects relies on donations to the Capital Improvement Campaign. The cost of the window replacement was \$10,495 and to date we have received \$7,220 for this project. The bid for the construction of the sound booth is \$8,200 and we have received donations totaling \$1,600. An additional piece of this project will be the purchase and installation of, and training for, a new digital soundboard and possibly the purchase of improved digital hearing devices. As we continue to maintain and upgrade our Church facilities, we ask you to prayerfully consider how you can support these enhancements to our Sanctuary. Thank you so much for the donations that have already been given.

George has made good progress. He is now able to go for short walks. They hope to be back in Medford by mid-July. Pray for continued improvement, and for the family members helping with his care.

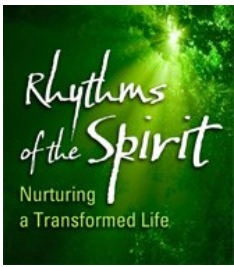

Ruth Hockersmith – Eastwood Baptist Church Scholarship

The Ruth Hockersmith Eastwood Baptist Church Scholarship is in memory of Ruth Hockersmith who taught Home Economics at Medford HS (before North-South). She and her husband Keith were members of Eastwood Baptist Church (An American Baptist Congregation) for many years. She retired in the mid 1980's. Her desire was to provide scholarships to worthy students with funds from the American Baptist Foundation located in Valley Forge, PA.

Each year the scholarship offices at North and South Medford High School will submit candidates to the finance committee. Candidates must have a letter of recommendation from their pastor, youth pastor, or church leader of their church and include a list of activities and volunteer work that they are involved in at their church.

This year we had a total of 6 candidates and the final recipients to receive a \$1400 scholarship are as follows: Maizy Kesterson from South High and Katharine Bloomquist and Courtney Denn from North High.

Additionally, because the Hockersmith Scholarship is specifically for students of North and South High, the Board of Deacons granted a \$1400 scholarship to our own Derek Tripp, Central Point High.

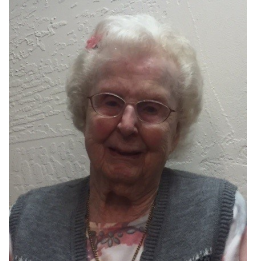

THE IMPORTANCE OF STONES

I can hear the conversations now. In one corner: "Did you see that pile of stones? What are they doing cluttering up the platform? Why would anyone put stones up there?" In a second corner: "Well, those stones must mean something, I just don't know what." And in a third corner: "What stones?"

As you have probably guessed, these are imaginary conversations but one part isn't made up. There is in fact a pile of stones at the front of the Sanctuary and they are there for a reason. During the past month the sermons have been built around the idea of wilderness journeys and what they can teach us about ourselves and God. On May 27th I talked about the importance of stones as markers of wilderness journeys, as testimonies to God's activities/presence in those journeys, and as markers to celebrate leaving the wilderness.

The stones you see in the Sanctuary were put in place as a marker for our interim journey, a reminder that our journey together, which may in some ways be likened to a wilderness journey, will one day come to an end. In the time between now and then we will be adding stones to our marker. Stones that will represent various congregational milestones such as the Search Committee completing another step in the search process, the celebration of the church's anniversary, graduation Sunday, etc.

If you look closely you will also notice that there are two other places where stones are gathering. Near each door there is a table on which a mosaic frame can be found and is the place where we are going to be creating a mosaic celebrating the end of our individual wilderness journeys.

On Sunday, I invited people to place a stone in one of the frames as a way to celebrate having completed a wilderness journey or to celebrate having a God moment during their current wilderness journey. You all are invited to do the same whenever you come to worship. As the mosaic forms are filled up we will set them in plaster to create stepping stones that will be placed in our church gardens.
