What Now?

He is Risen! so now what do we do? Our Lenten journey is over. We traveled to the upper room on Maundy Thursday with Jesus and his disciples. We heard Jesus say those powerful, effective words that are still effective when we hear them on Communion Sunday. We traveled to the foot of the cross and heard Jesus as he cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me"? We heard the words of finality that Jesus spoke with his last breath, "It is finished!" as he paid in full the price for the Sin that separates us from God. We traveled to the empty tomb to hear again about the group of women who went there early on the first day of the week to find it empty. "He is risen!" they are told. The final celebration of the Day of the Resurrection is over. Now what do we do?

We start by remembering that Easter is *more than just one day*. Easter is an every Sunday celebration during which we come together to remember that our sins have been forgiven, that we have the certainty of eternal life with God, and to worship and praise the Lord. Easter is also an every day celebration in which we live each day trusting in God through Christ, knowing that Jesus is the resurrection and the life for us.

Next we follow the example of the first witnesses of the empty tomb. After the two angels reminded Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women that Jesus had risen, Luke tells us "they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest." They went forth from the tomb changed by the resurrection of Jesus. They went from the tomb as witnesses of God's power over sin and death.

Then we follow the example of Jesus' first disciples. After Jesus walked through locked doors to appear to the eleven disciples and to show himself to Thomas, seven of the eleven disciples went back to their fishing business. They went back to their vocations or stations in life taking the witness of the resurrection with them. They lived in the joy of the resurrection of Jesus while carrying out the responsibilities of their daily lives. Their actions became witnesses of the life changing experience they had had.

We can be like them. We have the hope of eternal life. We have the joy of the resurrection *living* inside of us. Also, like the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we have vocations or stations in life that God has given to us as gift. Obviously, most of us are not fishermen, but all of us have one or more of these callings: father, husband, mother, wife, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandparent, employee, retiree, friend, and neighbor. Each of these callings comes with a set of duties and responsibilities. As repentant Christians, by God's grace we wrap the daily duties and responsibilities of our vocations in the joy, love, peace, and forgiveness of Christ. As we do so it is likely that others will take notice and God will bless our faithful work by giving us opportunities to tell all these things.

We go from Easter Sunday and the celebration of the empty tomb as God's forgiven children in Christ. We go empowered by God's Spirit living and active within us to live in the joy of the resurrection. We go as those called to remember and proclaim "He is Risen!"

Mission Summit

Summit by the Sea
JUNE 21-23, 2019
Virginia Beach, Virginia

If you've ever wanted to meet International Ministries (IM) global servants for a shared time of prayer, worship and opportunities for one-on-one discussions about global Christian mission activities and world events, there is no better venue than the American Baptist Churches Biennial Mission Summit.

The Biennial Mission Summit will be held June 21-23, 2019, at the Virginia Beach Convention Center in Virginia Beach, Virginia.

Registration is open now.

IM will be well represented by 24 global servants (including Kyle Williams and Mylinda Baits), plus IM staff and short-term volunteers.

In addition to many events, IM will conduct these special gatherings:

A Bible Study on Saturday, June 22 will be led by Kyle Witmer, IM global servant in Thailand entitled, "Fleeing to the Sea: Jonah's Prophetic Journey." Additional Bible studies will be conducted in Burmese, Spanish and French.

An Academy Track on Saturday, June 22, will offer a special 4-session event for those exploring a personal call to join God in global mission or for church leaders who can encourage those considering a call to serve. This interactive series will answer questions and tackle practical issues regarding what's involved in becoming an IM global servant. Led by the Rev. Dr. Rodney Ragwan and the IM Mission Mobilization team made up of global servants from around the world and IM staff.

An Evening Program hosted by IM will be on Saturday, June 22. The theme, "Across the Seas," will feature a keynote by the Rev. Elijah Brown, general secretary of the Baptist World Alliance. He will base his comments on Isaiah 11:9, "They will neither harm or destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as waters cover the sea."

The IM Luncheon will be held from noon to 2:00 pm on Sunday, June 23. Tickets are \$25 each and may be ordered when registering.

The Biennial Mission Summit, located in family-friendly Virginia Beach at the Virginia Beach Convention Center, is the national biennial event of American Baptist Churches USA. It will offer inspiring speakers and preachers, opportunities for education from experienced professionals and leaders through the ABCUSA Biennial Academy, chances for connection with both long-time American Baptists, and also new-to-ABC ministers and seminarians, Baptist Talk Conversation topics that directly affect local church ministry, and much more. Learn about American Baptist and partner ministries and experience the diverse family of American Baptist Churches USA! You are invited to bring your family for the event and plan to come early or stay after to vacation in Virginia Beach.

In addition to the IM track for those interested in global mission service, the ABCUSA Biennial Academy Tracks will include: Social Media, Technology and Ministry; Transformational Leadership and Renewal of the Church; Practical Resources for Churches and Leaders; sessions focused on social justice; Bible Study; Financial Wellness; Transition Ministries Training and more!

Admission to the ABCUSA Biennial Mission Summit admits you to all the programs, unless otherwise noted on the website.

Online registration ends on June 7. Onsite registration will be available at the event.
